




Keynote Speakers

E-Patient Dave - Dave DeBronkart

Advocate and Activist



Dave deBronkart, known on the internet as e-Patient Dave, is the author of the highly rated Let Patients Help: A Patient Engagement Handbook and one of the world's leading advocates for patient engagement. After beating stage IV kidney cancer in 2007 he became a blogger, health policy advisor and international keynote speaker. An accomplished speaker in his professional life before cancer, he is today the best-known spokesman for the patient engagement movement, attending over 650 conferences and policy meetings in 26 countries, including testifying in Washington for patient access to the medical record under Meaningful Use.

A co-founder and chair emeritus of the Society for Participatory Medicine, e-Patient Dave has appeared in Time, U.S. News, USA Today, Wired, MIT Technology Review, and the HealthLeaders cover story "Patient of the Future." His writings have been published in the British Medical Journal, the Patient Experience Journal, iHealthBeat, and the conference journal of the American Society for Clinical Oncology. In 2009 HealthLeaders named him and his doctor to their annual list of "20 People Who Make Healthcare Better," and he's appeared on the cover of Healthcare IT News and the Australian GP magazine Good Practice.

Dave's TED Talk Let Patients Help went viral, and for years was in the top half of

the most viewed TED Talks of all time with over a half million views; volunteers have added subtitles in 26 languages, indicating the global appeal of his message. In 2012 the National Library of Medicine announced that it's capturing his blog in its History of Medicine Division, and he was the Mayo Clinic's 2015 Visiting Professor in Internal Medicine.

Keynote Speakers

The Hon. Maryam Monsef

Founder & CEO, ONWARD



From 2015–2021, the Honourable Maryam Monsef served as Canada's Minister for Democratic Institutions, Minister for the Status of Women, Minister of International Development, and Minister of Rural Economic Development. She also established Canada's first full department for Women and Gender Equality. Today, as the founder and CEO of ONWARD, Monsef continues to advance her vision for a world where women and their families are thriving. She is a globally recognized feminist, leader, and changemaker who equips audiences with effective DEI strategies while sharing hard-earned lessons on leadership and resilience.

For two consecutive years, Monsef was recognized by Apolitical, as well as Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Michelle Obama, and Malala, as one of the "Top 20 Global Influencers on Gender Equality". After leaving politics, she founded ONWARD to build a community that empowers, connects, and supports women. It also acts as a resource for professional women feeling stuck at a difficult point in their lives.

An Afghan Canadian, Monsef came to Canada as a refugee. In 2015, she was elected as a Member of Parliament for Peterborough-Kawartha and joined Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's Cabinet. She was tasked with driving social and economic justice files for the Government of Can-

ada, both at home and abroad. Under her stewardship, Canada was recognized as a world leader in sexual and reproductive health and rights, for its investments in domestic and international grassroots women's organizations, and for its intersectional response to COVID-19.

Monsef currently chairs the Women United Campaign with the United Way Peterborough and District, is involved with the Trent University community, and works closely with Afghan women human rights defenders and other high-impact teams locally, nationally, and globally. Throughout her political career, Monsef has spoken at several high-profile events, including The World Economic Forum, the G7, the G20, and in front of the UN.

Dr. Kenneth Rockwood

Professor of Medicine (Geriatric Medicine & Neruology) and Clinical Research Professor of Frailty & Aging at Dalhousie University



Kenneth Rockwood, OC, MD, MPA, FRCPC, FRCP, is Professor of Medicine (Geriatric Medicine & Neurology) and Clinical Research Professor of Frailty & Aging at Dalhousie University. He has key roles on many studies of frailty and dementia in Canada and elsewhere. Ken's MD is from Memorial University in St. John's, NL in 1985. He completed training in Internal Medicine at the University of Alberta, and in Geriatric Medicine at Dalhousie. Since 1991 he has been a staff physician at Nova Scotia Health and since 2021 Senior Medical Director of its Frailty & Elder Care Network. Also, in 2021 Ken received the Ryman Prize. Awarded by the Prime Minister of New Zealand "the Ryman" is for the best work carried out anywhere that has enhanced quality of life for older people. Several honours have followed, recently capped by being named as an Officer of the Order of Canada. This is recognized in his home province as being "not too shabby for a Newfoundlander".


